The Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 is one of the most controversial laws that Congress has passed in recent years that will affect the business of importers, manufacturers and retailers of children's products. The law, which sets down strict limits on the levels of lead and phthalates in goods for children under 12, took effect Feb. 10. Regulations for the CPSIA are still a work in progress by the Consumer Product Safety Commission, and businesses are still unclear about what they should do to comply with the law.
